Warren County Cattlemen's Association Scholarship Program

Deadline to Apply 30 April 2016...

The purpose of the scholarship is to assist students in furthering their education with priority given, but not limited to, the field of agriculture or agriculture-related business.

Previous recipients of the scholarship must maintain a 2.5 grade average in order to reapply for another year. The applicant should be an individual in the senior year of high school or currently in college having completed high school with no extended break in his/her formal education. All applicants must be residents of Warren County and attending or planning to attend a North Carolina accredited college, community college or technical institute. Studies must be beyond the high school level.

Be sure that you have filed an application for admission to the 4-year accredited North Carolina college(s) or community college or technical school of your choice and be certain to arrange to take the College Entrance Examination Board Scholastic Aptitude Test and other appropriate entrance examinations which may be required by each institution to which you seek admission. It is the nominee's responsibility to make all arrangements for college admission.

Two scholarships in the amount of \$1000.00 each will be awarded to nominees with good high school records of achievement and a desire to further their education. In addition to academics, a student's involvement and accomplishments in the community, youth organizations, and work experience will be considered.

Lake Gaston Association Monthly Meeting

Scamming is the Topic

At the Lake Gaston Association's (LGA) monthly meeting on Wednesday, March 2 at 9:30 a.m., topics to be addressed will be identity theft, financial exploitation of older adults and internet safety for children.

Speakers will be Caroline Farmer a native of Raleigh, North Carolina who earned her undergraduate and law degree from UNC, and is the NC Attorney General's Deputy for public education. Randy Davis serves as the Virginia Attorney General's Community Outreach Coordinator and will explain what the Office is doing to go after those who commit health care fraud on the Commonwealth's most vulnerable citizens - the elderly and disabled, children and the poor. Q&A will follow.

The meeting will be held at the Lake Gaston Baptist Church located on Hwy. 903, 1 mile north of Eaton Ferry Bridge, across from the Subway Restaurant.

It will also provide an opportunity to get caught up on the various activities that the LGA Committees - Public Safety, Lake Environment, Government Relations, Marketing and Membership, Education and Lake Clean-Up - are working on.

Got a lake-related issue or concern that the LGA should be working on? There will be time allotted on the agenda to present those concerns to the LGA Board.
