Run Warrenton Registration...

Register Early for April 23 Race Prior To SpringFest

Registration is underway for Run Warrenton, the fourth annual spring 5k Race, Run, Walk, Scoot in downtown Warrenton. This year's event will benefit two organizations that assist military service members: the Yellow Ribbon Fund and the Semper Fi Fund.

The inaugural 5k in 2013 honored Warren County native Master Sergeant Cedric King, who lost both legs in 2012 during an explosion while serving with the U.S. Army in Afghanistan. King's mother, Sandra Williams, owner of Awesome God Christian Book Store in Warrenton, spearheaded the event, which has drawn around 250 participants each of the past two years and raised thousands of dollars.

This year's event is on **Saturday, April 23**, prior to Warrenton's annual SpringFest. Registration begins at 8 a.m. at the intersection of Market and Bragg streets, and the race/walk starts at 9 a.m. The registration fee is \$10 per person, and additional donations are accepted. All proceeds are tax-deductible. Checks may be made out to Run Warrenton.



Volunteers are needed to help on event day with registration and traffic control, and sponsors are also sought to help donate bottled water, fruit, energy bars and items for welcome bags.

Lake Area Health Care

What do you want to be when you grow up?

This wide open question of childhood elicits answers ranging from ballerina and Spiderman to teacher and doctor. No one imagines themselves, or their child, growing up homeless, jobless or addicted to drugs and alcohol. Yet data shows that for young people growing up in unhealthy family environments, substance use is a way to self-medicate their pain. For others, casual experimentation is all it takes to set them on a life-long, self-destructive path. Untreated mental illnesses such as depression, anxiety, PTSD and other disorders can have devastating effects on a young life and shortchange potential. **One in three families** is affected by mental illness or substance use. We all know or love someone with a behavioral health or substance use issue.

Lake Area Health Care (LAHC), operated by Freedom House Recovery Center, located at 126 North Main Street in Warrenton, provides behavioral health care through an array of wrap-around services to individuals and families. These services fill an urgent need in the community and help ease the burden on local emergency departments, court systems, correction facilities, and tax dollars.

LAHC provides vital wrap around services which include, but are not limited to a comprehensive clinical assessment, individual and group therapy, psychiatric evaluation and medication management. Additional resources include Substance Abuse Intensive Outpatient group and community intervention services, connecting consumers to primary health care, educational attainment, vocational rehabilitation and permanent housing. The dedicated treatment staff includes licensed clinicians and a psychiatric nurse practitioner who are available and ready to meet the behavioral health needs of children, adolescents and adults in the 5 County Area. Lake Area Health Care accepts Medicaid, Medicare, Private Insurance, State funds (IPRS) and Self Pay. Warren County Cattlemen’s Association Scholarship Program

Deadline to Apply 30 April 2016...

The purpose of the scholarship is to assist students in furthering their education with priority given, but not limited to, the field of agriculture or agriculture-related business.

Previous recipients of the scholarship must maintain a 2.5 grade average in order to reapply for another year. The applicant should be an individual in the senior year of high school or currently in college having completed high school with no extended break in his/her formal education. All applicants must be residents of Warren County and attending or planning to attend a North Carolina accredited college, community college or technical institute. Studies must be beyond the high school level.

Be sure that you have filed an application for admission to the 4-year accredited North Carolina college(s) or community college or technical school of your choice and be certain to arrange to take the College

Entrance Examination Board Scholastic Aptitude Test and other appropriate entrance examinations which may be required by each institution to which you seek admission. It is the nominee's responsibility to make all arrangements for college admission.

Two scholarships in the amount of \$1000.00 each will be awarded to nominees with good high school records of achievement and a desire to further their education. In addition to academics, a student's involvement and accomplishments in the community, youth organizations, and work experience will be considered.
